


### The species of animals

- Live on the highlands.






#### Icelandic horse

- The young horses are first ridden at the age of four.






### Icelandic sheep

- The sheep was brought by the Viking settlers in the 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> century.
- It is now illegal to import them.
- They mature early.
- The Icelandic sheep's wool.





### Goats and cats

- About 200 goats left in Iceland.
- A good Icelandic goat can milk about 200-300 liters per year.
- The cats breed hasn't changed.







# Icelandic sheepdog

• The Icelandic sheepdog is Iceland's only

native dog.

• The Nordic settlers brought it to the country.

- The dog was in danger of extinction.
- The Icelandic sheepdog is a valuable part of the county's heritage.

### Mink

- Came from Northern-America.
- Arrived to Iceland in 1931.
- Mink farms created.





#### Reindeers

- Reindeers are the largest land mammals in Iceland.
- Imported from Norway in the 18th century.
- Reindeer hunting is allowed in Iceland.
- Reindeer hunting is one of the most expensive sports in Iceland.
